

- 1 b** If possible, you must give way to buses moving into your lane on roads that have a speed limit of 70km/h or less (Buses follow the normal give way rules at intersections).
- 2 c** Use the “give way to the right” rule ONLY if the intersection is UNCONTROLLED, like this one.
- 3 b** The intersection is UNCONTROLLED, the “give way to the right” rule can be used here.
- 4 a** The yellow car is on the “terminating road” (the road which comes to end end) and must give way to cars in the intersection.

- 6 a** Cars turning right across the road must give way to cars facing them.
- 7 a** Vehicle ‘R’ is on the “terminating road” (the road which comes to end end) and must give way to cars in the intersection.

- 10 b** A “pedestrian refuge” is a place for pedestrians to wait for a safe gap in the traffic before crossing the road (it is not a pedestrian crossing, but you must give way to any person crossing the road). Pedestrian refuges in the NT do not have the red & yellow side barriers as shown in the photograph.
- 11 b** If possible, you must give way to buses moving into your lane on roads that have a speed limit of 70km/h or less. (Buses follow the normal give way rules at intersections).
- 12 c** The car turning right across the road gives way to the car facing it.
- 13 c** The car turning right across the road gives way to the car facing it.
- 14 a** This intersection is an UNCONTROLLED crossroads. The “give way to the right” rule is used here.
- 15 c** T-intersections are controlled. Car A is on the “terminating road” (the road which comes to an end) and must give way to cars on the other road.
- 16 a** T-intersections are controlled. Car B is on the “terminating road” (the road which comes to an end) and must give way to cars on the other road.
