

- 1 b** Obey the arrows on the entrance lanes, and signs such as this one:



- 2 a** Signalling 'left' before leaving helps to improve the traffic flow by advising vehicles further round the roundabout if it is safe to enter.
It helps in keeping the traffic flowing.

- 4 b** Do not change lanes in a roundabout.

- 5 a** The painted arrow in lane A tells you that you may only turn left.

- 6 c** Do not change lanes in a roundabout.

- 8 c** The painted lane arrows tell you that you can use either lane.

- 9 c** If you are not sure if a car is leaving the roundabout or not, always assume that it will pass in front of you, and prepare to give way to it.

- 10 a** If done correctly, using roundabouts is a safe way of turning around and going the back the other way.

- 11 b** Do NOT do a right turn from the left lane, or do a left from a right lane, at any intersection unless signs or painted lane arrows give you permission to do so.

- 13 a** The lane arrows must be obeyed.
Do NOT do a right turn from the left lane, or do a left from a right lane, at any intersection unless signs or painted lane arrows give you permission to do so.
