1 **b** Obey the arrows on the entrance lanes, and signs such as this one:



- **2 a** Signalling 'left' before leaving helps to improve the traffic flow by advising vehicles further round the roundabout if is safe to enter. It helps in keeping the traffic flowing.

- **4 b** Do not change lanes in a roundabout.
- **5 a** The painted arrow in lane A tells you that you may only turn left.
- **6 C** Do not change lanes in a roundabout.
- 7 a
- **8 C** The painted lane arrows tell you that you can use either lane.
- **9 C** If you are not sure if a car is leaving the roundabout or not, always assume that it will pass in front of you, and prepare to give way to it.
- **10 a** If done correctly, using roundabouts is a safe way of turning around and going the back the other way.
- **11 b** Do NOT do a right turn from the left lane, or do a left from a right lane, at <u>any</u> intersection unless signs or painted lane arrows give you permission to do so.

- **13 a** The lane arrows must be obeyed.
