You have a responsibility to ensure the safety of yourself and others on the road.

Always watch for unexpected behaviour of children, pedestrians and drivers, and treat them with courtesy & consideration.

Just because you think you are in the right, it does not always mean you should go ahead.

Sometimes you might have to give way to another vehicle entering an intersection illegally, if necessary to do so to avoid a crash.

Remember, a driver can be blamed for a crash even if a road rule was not broken!
